Please find the flashcards for the sounds we have learned this week:

'e,' 'ck,' 'r,' 'u.'

We talked about how the grapheme - 'ck' - is a digraph. A digraph has two letters for one sound. When we see the grapheme 'ck', we just say the sound /k/ one time as in 'd-u-ck.' We will find it at the end of words.

Please can you help your child to cut them out using scissors.

Hold up the flashcards for your child to say the matching sound. Use pure sounds. This means saying "p" (a plosion of air from your mouth with no voice), not "puh."

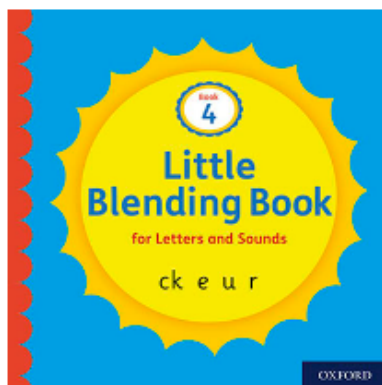
