The banging makes the ferris wheel burst with light

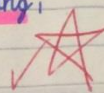
How their eyes filled with glee

The jubilant fireworks soar across the shooting, elegant sky

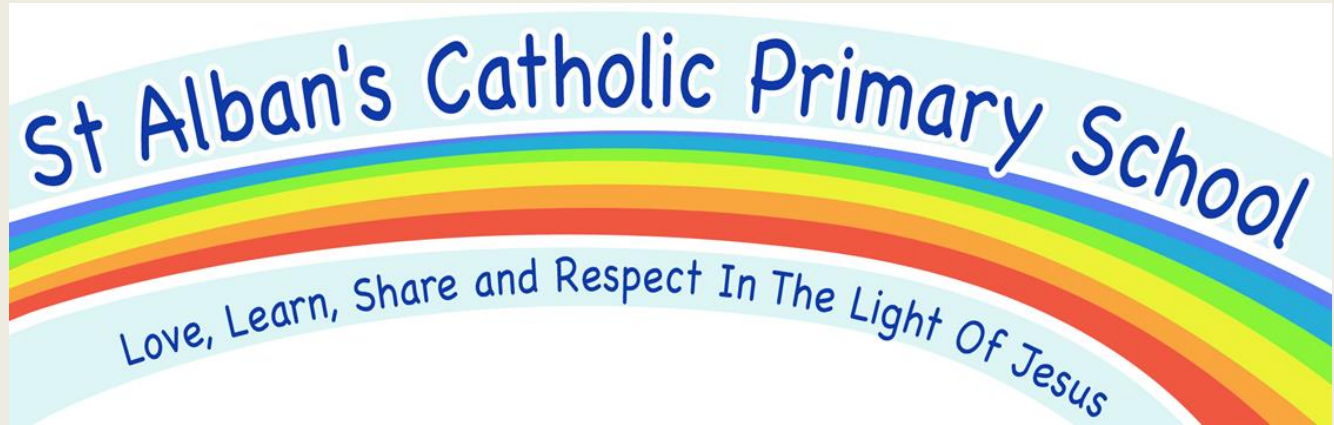
The audience applauds, then stillness

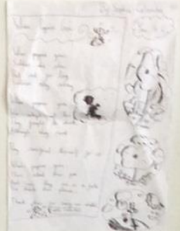

Soldiers stay strong

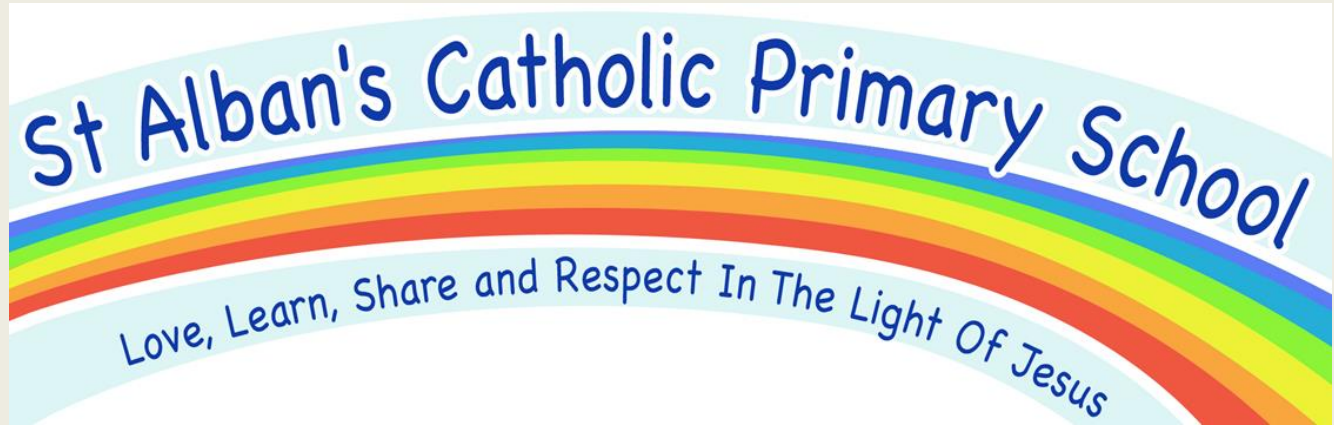
Where poppies grow,
