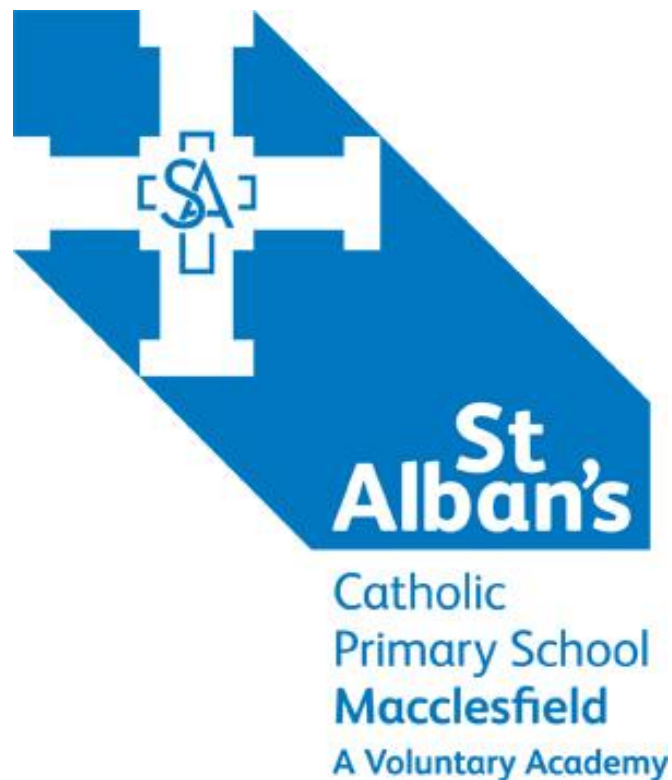

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ACTIVITIES/ISSUES	POLICY
Residential Courses in school time.	Parents/carers are required to meet the full cost of the residential visit, except for parents/carers of children eligible for Pupil Premium Funding, where the cost may be supported from the Pupil Premium Grant. If the income for each activity does not meet the overall cost, such activities may have to be cancelled.
Activities outside school hours not within the National Curriculum	Parents/carers are required to meet the full cost, except for parents/carers of children eligible for Pupil Premium Funding, where the cost may be supported from the Pupil Premium Grant. If the income for each activity does not meet the overall cost, such activities may have to be cancelled.
Activities within school hours e.g. school trips, visitors to school; authors, artists, theatre groups, etc.	Voluntary contributions may be requested from parents/carers. If the income for each activity does not meet the overall cost, such activities may have to be cancelled.
Individual Tuition e.g. Music	Where the school provides an 'outside' tutor, parents/carers will be charged for the tuition. For parents/carers of children eligible for Pupil Premium Funding, the cost may be supported from the Pupil Premium Grant.
Ingredients/materials for practical subjects	Parents/carers are encouraged to provide materials/ donations for practical subjects, but no child will be disadvantaged because of parents' inability/reluctance to pay. Where necessary, school will pay the cost of this.
Lost school equipment, books, etc	Parents/carers may be requested to replace school equipment, books, etc. which have been lost by their child.
Breakages and damages to school buildings, furniture or property	Wilful damage to school buildings or property by a pupil may be charged to parents/carers by the school.
